the 40-day period leading up to Easter Sunday, is a time of reflection and represents the 40 days that Jesus spent alone in the wilderness before starting his ministry, a time in which Christians believe he survived various temptations by Satan. The week preceding Easter is called Holy Week and includes Maundy Thursday, which commemorates Jesus' last supper with His disciples; Good Friday which honors the day of His crucifixion and resurrection. The 50-day period following Easter Sunday is called Eastertide and includes a celebration of Jesus' ascension into heaven. Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection occurred after he went to Jerusalem to celebrate Passover (or Pesach in Hebrew), the Jewish festival commemorating the ancient Israelites exodus from slavery in Egypt. Pesach eventually came to mean Easter.

I don't know about you, but my family loves having brunch for some of our Easter get-togethers! We love breakfast casseroles and it's nice to have some healthy options that are still delicious!

Healthy French Toast Casserole

Ingredients: 9 sprouted bread slices like Ezekiel bread, cut in large cubes 4 eggs 1 cup egg whites 1 cup almond milk, unsweetened 1 tbsp pure vanilla extract ½ tsp. liquid stevia ½ tsp. cinnamon ½ cup pecans, coarsely chopped 1 tbsp. brown sugar Coconut oil cooking spray or Pam Honey or pure maple syrup Greek yogurt (optional)

Directions:

Spray an 11X7 baking dish with cooking spray. Place bread in, spreading evenly. In medium bowl whisk eggs, egg whites, almond milk, vanilla, stevia and cinnamon. Pour mixture evenly over the bread. Cover tight and refrigerate overnight or 2 nights. When ready to bake, preheat oven to 350 degrees and sprinkle casserole with pecans and brown sugar.

Bake uncovered for 45-50 minutes. Serve warm with a little drizzle of honey or maple syrup and/or Greek yogurt if desired.
