Here's a recipe for ribs so even though they're not made on the grill, they still make me feel like spring is right around the corner! And who doesn't love the crockpot? My family likes more of a dry rub then saucy ribs, so when I first ran across this recipe, I just had to try it. Maple syrup and cinnamon? Yum! The whole family loved these! Maple Slow Cooker Boneless Ribs

Ingredients:

11/2 lbs boneless pork ribs
¹/₄ cup maple syrup
¹/₄ cup soy sauce
1 Tablespoon Worcheshire sauce
2 Tablespoons dried onion flakes
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon'
1 teaspoon ground allspice
1 Tablespoon minced garlic, about 6 cloves
1 Tablespoon grated ginger
Dash hot sauce
Ground black pepper

Directions:

Sprinkle ribs with pepper and rub into surface. Place meat in slow cooker. Combine remaining ingredients in a small bowl. Pour sauce over meat. Cook on low 6-8 hours or high 3-4 hours.

Overview of Monthly Board Meeting

The SLLOA Board met on March 1st at 7:00 P.M.

The board welcomed new member Craig Hawes. He was unanimously approved and we are looking forward to utilizing a few of Craig's many talents.

The board spent a few minutes reviewing the annual meeting presentation for high and low points. It is our intention to constantly improve and find best practice processes in everything the board does.

The board also reviewed the current ski course agreement. In May 2016, the board gave Scott Towsley permission to leave the ski course up full-time with the course being submerged when not in use. It is stipulated that the course must not be used after 11:00 A.M. on weekends and holidays. In exchange, Scott was to arrange possible ski lessons as well as safety classes for other lake members. The current ski course proposal to the board states that a ski club formed by members using the course would maintain liability insurance with Schaefer Lake being listed as insured on the policy. This arrangement was challenged at the annual meeting. The board is now in the process of researching whether or not a club policy exist as well as obtaining confirmation from our liability carrier as to the coverage we carry for a skier using the course as well as coverage of a skier, tuber, or boater involved with the course. This item will be placed back on the April agenda for further discussion until research into these details has been accomplished.

The yearly contract with Rising Sun Aquatics has been renewed for 2017. Two scheduled weed control applications may be made during the growing season. The first from late April to May for early season control and the second from mid July to August for late season control.

The Social Committee announced that the Easter Egg Hunt will be held on Lot #90 on April 8, 2017 at 10:30 A.M. The annual Fishing Tournament is in the planning stages but a date has not been set at this time. More details to follow.

Jamie Champlin asked the board to consider posting "Slow...Children at Play" signs with the onset of spring and more children riding bikes and playing close to the drives. She will research the cost of the signs and present at the April meeting.

The remainder of the meeting was devoted to the review and maintenance of our short term and long term goals.

The next board meeting will be held on April 19, 2017 at 7:00 PM at the home of Jamie and Mike Champlin.
