#### **Board Meeting Updates**

The SLLOA Board met on June 22, 2017. The following items were discussed with action taken as noted:

- **Dam Maintenance Day** was reviewed and a list of accomplishments noted. A big thank you to all who helped out by volunteering of their time and energy to keep the dam area looking great!
- **New Signage** has arrived and will soon be put in place encouraging folks to slow down and watch for our children at play. The signs are attractive and match the Schaefer Lake sign at the boat ramp. Thanks to Carrie Trotter for ordering the signs and Brent Engel for seeing that they are installed!
- **Ski Course** The ski course has been an ongoing agenda item at recent board meetings. The board felt that liability insurance was an issue that needed to be secured. The board has voted to change insurance agents for the lake however, only the agent has changed not the carrier. We are

still insured through Cincinnati Insurance Company with the same coverage as in past years with the addition of the ski course now being added to our policy. The course was donated to the SLLOA by Scott Towsley and will now be maintained by the lake. The change in agents also provided a notable savings in yearly premium costs.

- <u>Water Testing</u> Jamie Champlin has tested our lake water at several locations and the lab results show that our numbers for ecoli and nitrates are well below the accepted standards. Jamie does this testing periodically throughout the summer from different locations to keep us informed as to the quality of our water.
- The next board meeting will be held on Thursday, July 20<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 PM. All meetings are open and we welcome any topics for discussion that the lot owners may have.

Its summer time and you know what that means......boating, swimming, vacations, relaxing, baseball, and....pitch-ins! Need a new recipe for a side dish you can take to your next pitch-in? Here's an easy, healthy, and tasty one to take along, especially if you like some extra kick. Cauliflower Buffalo wings! Mmmm!

#### **Cauliflower Buffalo Wings**

Ingredients: 1 head cauliflower 1 c. milk <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> c. whole wheat flour 1 T. garlic powder

Directions:

Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Trim the head of cauliflower into bite-size pieces and set aside. In a bowl, stir together the milk, flour, and garlic powder. Dip each piece of cauliflower into the batter and allow the extra batter to drip off. Place on a greased baking sheet and spray the top of the florets with cooking oil. Bake for 18 minutes. Melt butter in a saucepan over low heat and add hot sauce, then stir. Toss cooked cauliflower pieces with sauce and put back on the cookie sheet and bake for 5-7 minutes in the oven. Remove and serve with a side of blue cheese dressing, celery, and carrots.
