During the hustle and bustle of the Christmas season sometimes you just want a quick easy meal to make for dinner. This is one of my favorites! It is very easy to make, quite tasty, and even pretty good for you! I hope you enjoy it as much as we did.

Sweet Potato Buffalo Chicken Casserole

<u>Ingredients</u>:

1 lb. boneless skinless chicken breasts cut into cubes

4 sweet potatoes cut into cubes

1 Tbsp. paprika

2 Tbsp. garlic powder

6 Tbsp. hot sauce

½ cup olive oil

1 cup bacon, cooked and cut into pieces

1 cup green onions, sliced

Sea salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste


Directions:

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F.

In a large bowl, combine olive oil, paprika, garlic powder, hot sauce, and season with salt and pepper to taste.

Add the chicken and sweet potatoes and stir to coat. Empty the bowl into a casserole dish and bake in the oven for approximately 45-50 minutes. Stir every 10-15 minutes. Add the green onions (I used a sweet onion) and bacon to the dish and place back in the oven for another 5 or so minutes to let all the flavors combine.
