Taking stock of fish-stocking plan

The Schaefer Lake Lot Owners Association has made two investments in its fish population this past year, reflecting \$4,000 in monies budgeted for each of 2018 and 2019.

The most recent stocking was June 21, when 1,200 Bluegill Sunfish ranging from 4 to 6 inches were stocked, as well as 300 Largemouth Bass ranging from 5 to 7 inches long. Rounding out the order from

Jones Fish of Cincinnati were 105 pounds of Fathead Minnows (roughly 25,000 of them), providing ample feeding opportunities for the lake's fish.

Schaefer Lake has typically stocked the lake in the spring. With a new lake association leadership stepping in last year, however, the 2018 schedule for stocking was delayed until the fall, said board member Anthony Paul, who oversaw the stocking program.

Paul worked with Jones Fish last fall to stock the lake with 500 Hybrid Striped Bass, which are known to eat the pesky shad, which feast on fish eggs in the spring and fall. The striped bass ran from 8 to 10 inches long, a size that would allow them to survive the winter months and be large enough to eat the shad, Paul said. The association last fall also purchased 25 pounds of Flathead Minnows to feed the lake's fish.

Managing water levels

The Schaefer Lake Lot Owners Association board has been spending a lot of time on issues related to water levels. For example, a full assessment of the Emergency Spillway Project was provided to the membership during this year's annual meeting.

When we get a heavy rainfall, as we did most recently in June, some association members have asked that the 24-inch drawdown pipe be opened to drop water levels.



At the lake association board's request, a hydraulic flow analysis by Burke Engineering of Columbus reviewed the Schaefer Lake discharge capacity from two significant storm events.

At 100-year-flood conditions, the flow capacity of the drawdown pipe has an impact of lowering the lake by 3/64 inch on the maximum lake level, the Burke Engineering study found. That's 0.5 percent above the flow capacity of the main spillway – not enough to make a significant difference, Burke found.

As a result of this information provided during the annual meeting, the lake association board recommends that the 24-inch drawdown pipe not be implemented during an anticipated storm event.

The Schaefer Lake main spillway was moving water over the dam quickly June 22 after a storm.

French Toast on a Stick

Here's a breakfast recipe that is super fun to make with kiddos or for you if you're a kid at heart.

For the French toast:

Ingredients

- 4 eggs
- 1 T unsweetened almond milk
- 1 T cinnamon
- 1 tsp pumpkin pie spice
- 1-2 T raw honey
- 2 tsp vanilla
- 4 slices wheat or Ezekiel bread (I used homemade Honey Oat bread from a little shop near my house, Swiss Maid)

Instructions

Heat skillet over medium to medium high heat, spray with cooking spray Mix all ingredients and spices together in shallow bowl/dish (except bread) Coat both sides of bread in egg and spice mixture and put on skillet Cook for a couple minutes on each side or until golden brown Serve with fresh berries and some pure maple syrup

^{*}You can also use a baguette cut into 1 inch slices if you like it thicker

Then for the "on a stick" part.

Ingredients

the cubed French toast 10 strawberries (or more) 1 banana (or more) 1/2 cup blueberries (or more)

Slide a piece of French toast, a strawberry half, a slice of banana, and a blueberry onto a skewer. Continue until skewer is full. Repeat to make more.

Serve by itself or with pure maple syrup. Enjoy!!
